## Law Enforcement Panel Works Closely with New TRPD Team

As part of its ongoing operational review, the Twin Rivers District Police Department (TRPD) held the first meeting of its Law Enforcement Professional Panel on February 29<sup>th</sup>. This panel of law enforcement professionals is assisting with a review of the Department's operations and is giving advice on the adequacy of steps taken to date to address areas of concern. They are also providing suggestions as to additional areas the Department may benefit from addressing. The panel will meet again on March 7<sup>th</sup> and it is anticipated that two to four additional meetings will be scheduled before its work is completed.

The group discussed TRDPD's revised traffic stop and towing policy, redirection of staff to school campuses, phasing out services to local park districts, equipment audits and inventories, relationships with the community and local law enforcement partners, review and compliance with Department policies and security of Department facilities.
