Heavy Lifting at Grant Union High School

SACRAMENTO – Removing rooftop air conditioning units that weigh between 500 and 700 pounds requires bringing in the big machinery. And big machinery is exactly what you will see June 19 at Grant Union High School.

A 75-ton crane will lift aging and inefficient heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) units off the school roof starting at 10 a.m. The project, launched at an April 2 news conference as part of the “Feel the Difference” campaign, is moving forward at a quick pace.

In fact, Twin Rivers USD is on track to meet a commitment to the community to upgrade and install new HVAC units at Grant and Harmon Johnson Elementary before the 2014-2015 school year begins on Aug. 14.

Students and staff will “Feel the Difference” in their classrooms.
