FREE PSAT and SAT

McClellan, CA— Twin Rivers Unified students and families will not be charged for the College Board’s Preliminary SAT (PSAT) and the SAT college entrance exam, which will be administered on Wednesday, Oct. 19. Nearly 7,000 students in grades eight through eleven will take the PSAT and approximately 1,500 seniors will take the SAT.

“Preparing our students to graduate college and career ready is our top priority, and we must ensure that all students have access to the tools they need to prepare for college,” says Twin Rivers Superintendent Dr. Steve Martinez. “The PSAT will provide valuable feedback on strengths and skills necessary for college and career. It will also help our teachers identify students with potential to succeed in rigorous Advanced Placement (AP) courses.”

WHAT: Twin Rivers Unified PSAT and SAT Day

WHEN: Wednesday, Oct. 19

WHERE: Various sites, including each high school **(NO cameras/reporters in classrooms during testing; can videotape between 7 – 7:30 a.m. before testing starts)**

The PSAT is a standardized test that assesses critical reading, math and writing skills. It prepares students for college admission tests like the SAT, and is the qualifying test for National Merit Scholarships. The SAT is the most widely used college admission test in the country.
